

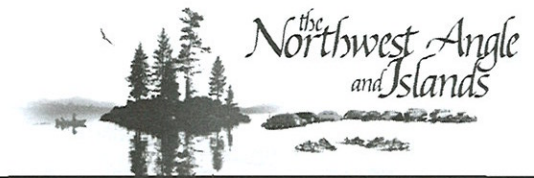

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### How to Get Here

The Northwest Angle and Islands is accessible by car (mainland of the Northwest Angle), air, watercraft, snowmobile, bombardier or your own boat. Area businesses can make travel arrangements to your destination when you make reservations.

**AUTOMOBILE:** From Warroad, go north on Hwy. 313 to Sprague, Manitoba. From Roseau, take Hwy. 310 to South Junction, turn right to Sprague, Manitoba. From Sprague, go north on Hwy 308. Watch for the Northwest Angle sign (junction 525). Turn right onto Hwy. 525 and proceed to Jim's Corner.

**AIR:** Plane service is available out of International Falls. Personal float planes can also be used.

**WATER:** The Island Passenger Service, winter bombardier service, or the ice road from the mainland provide access to the island businesses, a short 10-mile, 15 to 20 minute ride through the island section of the lake. Transportation services are also available across the lake from Baudette, MN, and Warroad, MN.

**SNOWMOBILE:** Snowmobile Trail Maps are available for arrivals by sled. Departures can be from Roseau, Warroad, Baudette or the mainland of the Northwest Angle & Islands.

### Customs/ Border Crossing Information

Visitors entering the Northwest Angle & Islands via the road will need passports (tentatively scheduled for June of 2009 implementation). Until the passport requirement is fully implemented, you will need to present a government issued ID (driver's license) as proof of identity, along with proof of citizenship (birth certificate or naturalization certificate). Up-to-date information is available through [travel.state.gov](http://travel.state.gov) if you have a current passport now, that is the most preferred travel document.

Once you have cleared the Canadian Customs at South Junction (Roseau) or Sprague (Warroad), you will travel approximately 50 miles through Canada to the Angle. Once you are back in the USA, you will see a big **BLUE** sign with immigration information. Please take a minute to read the sign, then proceed approximately 8 miles to Jim's Corner and STOP at the USA/Canadian OARS phone. You must report – press the button with the US flag to talk to a US Immigration official.

If you arrive/depart the Northwest Angle via boat or snowmobile, please follow the same directions using OARS phones located at Young's Bay or at the bridge near Angle Inlet School. Cyclone Island has a phone for clearance back into Canada only.

Leaving the Angle, remember to stop at the phone, press the Canadian flag to speak with a Canadian official who will give you clearance back into Canada. Be sure to get a clearance number from the Canadian official; if you are stopped by a Canadian official on a road check, that number proves you "cleared customs." Continue to the Warroad or Roseau, MN, U.S. Customs Office.

A REMOTE AREA BORDER CROSSING (RABC) permit allows you to cross the border at certain remote areas without reporting to a port of entry, as long as you declare your imported goods by calling 807-852-3986. RABC permit applications may be picked up and processed at any Canada Customs Building (Fort Frances, Rainy River, Emerson) or call 1-800-642-2158.
