Welcome to the Northern Lights Model Railroad Association & Railroad Museum. We are located on the grounds of the Heritage Village in East Grand Forks, MN. Which is located 100 miles south of the Canadian Border in the heart of the Red River Valley.



The Northern Lights Model Railroad Association as it is known today, was conceived in 1977 by Mr. John Cummings. He collected Lionel and HO scale model trains. Mr. Cummings also wanted to meet with others to trade, swap and run trains.

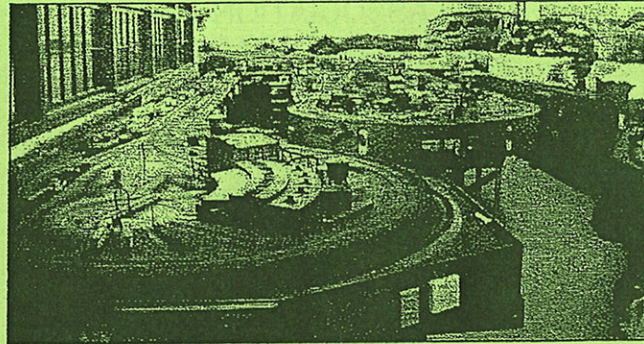
Our location was the second level of the City Center Mall. Because of the irreparable damage caused by the Great Flood of 1997, the City of Grand Forks decided to remove the building. Consequently the Club was forced to find a new home. Over time and after much discussion by our members, it was decided that we pursue our own facilities.

On land leased from the Heritage Village Foundation, we built a 58'x26' building to resemble a train depot. A 32'x17' room houses our model railroad layout. The building also includes meeting room, telegraph office with bay window and public viewing hall. The club also has 300 feet of standard gage railroad track with restored caboose.

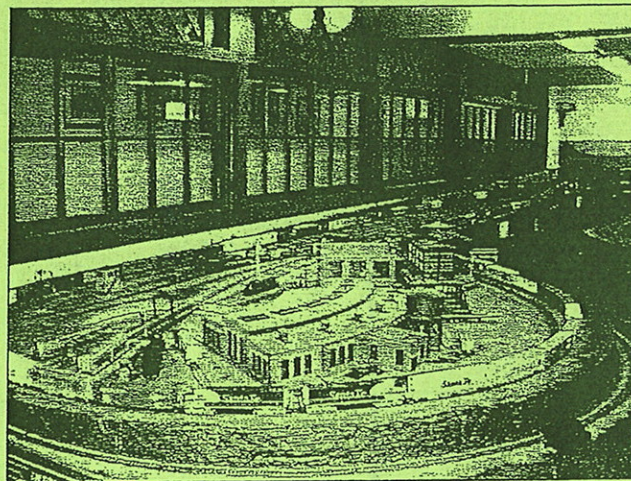
An operating block signal and motor car house are located just east of the main building.

The CASEY HOLT JUNCTION building is named after the son of Tim Holt. Casey was fatally injured in an automobile accident.

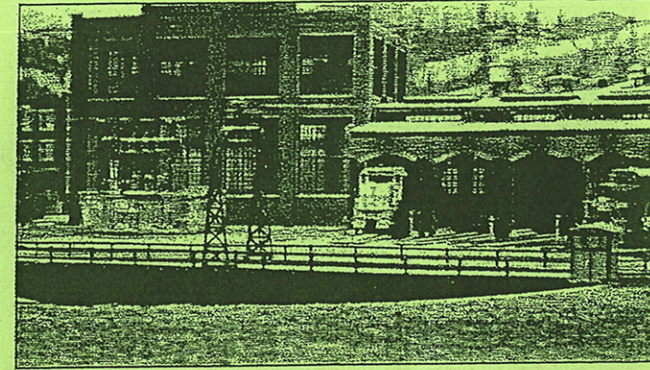
The layout is all DCC or computer controlled with a double dog bone track plan with no duck unders. This has the capacity to allow 99 engineers to operate at one-time independent of each other. A public viewing hall is located on the north side of the building.



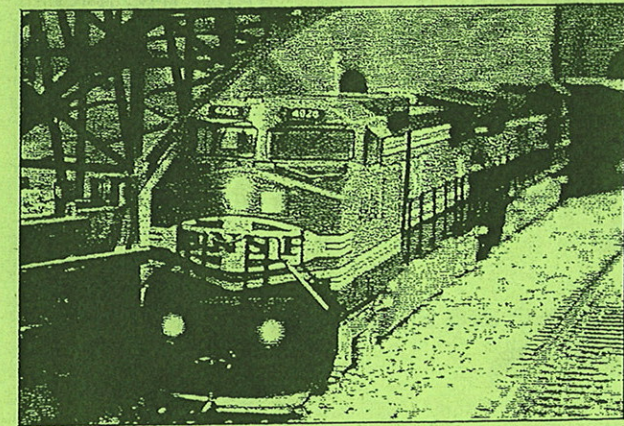
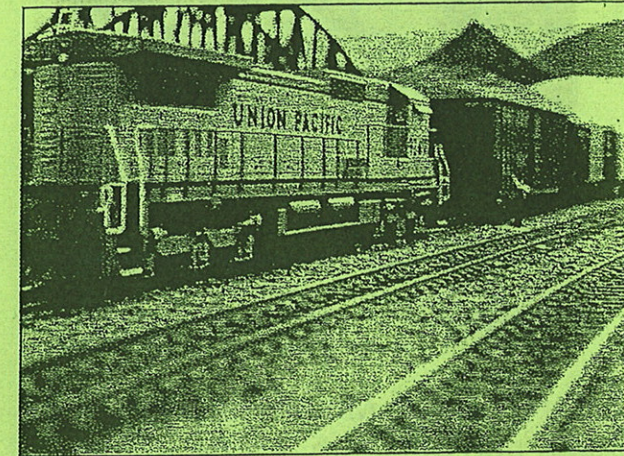
Front View of Train Room
